
#### Fill the Hill Micro-Fundraiser

In the fall of 2013, we brought alumni gifts to UW-Madison to life by planting pink plastic flamingos on the largest hill on campus. And thanks to digital technology, donors anywhere in the world could track the progress of our efforts and encourage their peers to give. To keep the campaign a surprise, the only promotion was through email and social media.

#### **Email**

Emails were segmented by recency of graduation (alumni who graduated less than ten years ago, or more than ten years ago). Older alumni are very familiar with the flamingo tradition, including many who were in school at the time of the original prank. More recent graduates are aware that the flamingo is a symbol of UW's spirit and good humor, even if they don't know the origins of the tradition.
